- Applying for Summer Research Programs
  - Why should you apply for summer programs?
    - Spend summer being paid to do science
    - Chance to find out what you like in physics

- Make connections for future career
- Make yourself more competitive for grad school
- Types of programs
  - Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REUs)
    - NSF-Funded
    - Typically Hosted by a University
  - Science Undergraduate Laboratory Internships (SULI)
    - Through the US Department of Energy (DOE)
    - Hosted at National Laboratories
    - Will accept International Students
    - Earlier Deadline
  - Other Internships
- Types of Programs (Through Truman)
  - TruScholars
    - Through Truman Office of Student Research
    - Must find a faculty mentor to work with
    - Funded (up to \$3000 stipend, plus \$500 supplies/travel)
  - McNair
    - Program for First-Generation/Low-Income students and/or underrepresented students
    - Resources to help go to grad school
    - Including summer research
    - Must apply and be accepted into Truman McNair Program
- Tips for a strong resume
  - Not too dense-- can be scanned quickly & easily
  - Consistent formatting
  - Strong verbs
  - Highlight relevant experiences & transferable skills
  - Don't use high school stuff
    - Exception: freshmen
  - Have someone proofread it!
- Resume Resources
  - The <u>Career Center</u>
    - Will critique your resume from 8-5 on weekdays
    - Has resources to help with resume writing
    - They generally take walk ins if they aren't too busy
  - Dr. Edis has example resumes from science students on his site
  - Google has TONS of templates
- The Personal Statement
  - Be sure to address:
    - Your interest in This Specific program
    - How it helps you further career & academic goals
    - Why You are a good fit

- Some sites prioritize students with fewer resources at their home institution
  - If Truman doesn't have the subfield you want, mention that
  - How have you taken advantage of the resources you do have?
- Letters of Recommendation
  - Ask for letters early (like, before thanksgiving break)
    - Choose writers who know you well
      - Your research advisor
        - It would look weird if you didn't have a letter from your research advisor
      - Supervisor from science-related job
      - o Professors whose classes you did well in
    - Ask in person if possible, and bring resume & personal statement
    - You SHOULD ask point-blank if they can write you a strong letter
      - You do not want a generic letter
